## THE VENUE

Lake Dewar YMCA Lodge is less than 65 km from Melbourne, 3 km from the Western Highway and 15 mins past Bacchus Marsh. The venue is modern and comfortable. The conference centre overlooks an attractive lake and is surrounded by 250 acres of bushland with native birds and animals.



## THE MUSIC

The music for small ensembles and 'big-blow' sessions will represent a range of styles, from both early and more contemporary repertoire. Two threads will be followed through from recent Guild sessions: Diane Draper will continue to magic jazz out of our instruments, and Roger Palmer will explore the ways a knowledge of Renaissance dance shows us how to play the music that accompanies it.



## THE TUTORS

We are fortunate to have wonderful tutors leading sessions for this weekend. Amy Power, a young recorder graduate of the University of Melbourne and currently based in Basle, Switzerland, will take a master class and will perform in the Saturday night's concert. Other tutors include Katrina Dowling, Diane Draper, Ursula Genaehr, Peter Madge, Roger Palmer, Viv Spencer, Barb Williams and Liz Zetzmann.

## ACCOMMODATION

Most accommodation is in the Conference Centre in rooms of up to four participants. Bathroom facilities are shared with easy access from every room. Extra top bunks are provided in some rooms. You are asked to BYO towels and bed linen (or hire from the venue for a small additional fee).

If you have special needs you may request one of the smaller rooms or one of the rooms with ensuite facilities on your registration form.

Lakeview Apartments accommodate four or more participants per unit. Family groups taking advantage of the weekend to enjoy a holiday will be given priority for these units.

All meals, plus morning and afternoon teas, are provided and the catering staff do all the cleaning up. Local wines are on sale in the dining-room.

If you prefer to live off-site, accommodation is available in the township of Myrniong (about 8 km away), Bacchus Marsh (about 15 km) and in the more populous tourist region around Trentham, Blackwood and Daylesford.
